Esports Ecosystem



COMMON QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS





My student is not engaged in or motivated by their studies and is performing poorly in core classes.

My student isn't interested in getting involved.

My student is not able to join an athletic team, or is otherwise not interested in joining.

How can we improve their leadership or team-building skills?

Additionally, joining an esports team supports the development of leadership, problem solving, and communication skills.

As a player, your student can receive an opportunity at a professional career, whether it be at the collegiate, semi-pro, or professional level. In high school alone, your student can have four years of experience under their belt to help support them, no different than baseball, soccer, or football.
